

YELLOW MARKINGS	7 km	Saint-Ybard <i>From falls to viaducts</i>

Downstream from the **Bialet falls**, on the banks of the **Vezere**, near the **confluence of the Saint-Ybard stream and the Vezere**, stand the **former forge remains**. A few tens of metres away along the Vezere, you will discover the **Gour-Noir viaduct**, the longest in Europe with only one granite arch.

This delightful walk alongside the water leads you to the **viaduct of the A20 motorway**. Heading up to the village of Bouchiat, you can discover the charming Vezere Valley.

Access to the departure from Saint-Ybard:

Follow direction Sadarnac, then the “Cascades de Bialet” itinerary for about 5km.

[D] From the car park of the Bialet falls, walk down the path to the left toward the falls. After a **500m loop around the falls**, go back to the car park.

Take the path along the stream bordering the falls.

[1] At about 500 metres, take a left path that goes down to the Vezere banks. On the left again, you will cross the Saint Ybard stream by a small bridge and you will be walking on the path that leads you to the **forges remains**.

Continue along this path and about a hundred metres upstream, you will soon discover the **Gour-Noir viaduct**. Turn around and reach the main path at your left.

[2] Under the motorway viaduct, continue on your right on a sloping track.

[2b] Go up on the left under the motorway bridge to have a **point of view that spans the Vezere**.

[3] Walk up to the village of Bouchiat – **viewing point**.

[3b] Turn around to enjoy the **viewing point**.

[4] Follow the road and turn right at the Royere crossroads to reach the Bialet falls.
