- [1] Walk down the street between the tourist information office and the bakery.
- [2] Before you cross the footbridge, on the Paris-Toulouse SNCF line, notice, at the bottom left, the former hospital and its chapel.
- [3] Cross and go down to the Old Bridge called “Pont des Anglais” (British Bridge). Stop for a moment to admire this magnificent bridge dated the 14th century and that is told to be built by the British, with its sturdy abutments and its almond-shape cutwaters. This bridge is listed as a historic monument. Several old houses with charming balconies embellish its environment.
- [4] Go past the hikers and canoe-kayak amateurs gite on your right.
- [5] Follow the path of the former cotton mills (used to be built along the Vezere). You will arrive on the D7 that you follow on the right. Cross the Jargassou Bridge and turn immediately left before the Railway Bridge.
- [6] Cross the footbridges that span the millrace of a former hydroelectric factory leaning back against the bridge. This factory was built in 1907 and belonged to the *Château du Repaire* owner (situated on the Objat road after Viallevaleix). Then the path goes peacefully along the Vezere River.
- [7] On the other riverbank, you will notice the abandoned cotton mills.
- [8] After the wooden stairs, between the rocks and the SNCF dykes, the path goes up to the railway, goes down to the left and leads to the pine forest.
- [9] Turn around at the stream of Anglard to come back to Vigeois because this is where the GR46 goes under the railway. Continues to Uzerche through a 2km long road and then walk along the Vezere again.
- [10] Take the same itinerary in order to reach the *Place de l’Eglise*.
