

YELLOW MARKINGS	5,2 km	<b>Uzerche</b> <i>Into the footsteps of Simone de Beauvoir</i>
<b>Family</b>	Descents 295 Climbs 315	

Start from the Small Station, starting point of the POC (*Paris Orléans Corrèze*) until the 70's. Follow the old railway track, today GR 46, going along the *Garenne de Puy Grolier*, to the buildings of the formers cotton mills, then cross the bridge at the confluence of the Espartignac stream with the Vezere. Take the road at your right for 200 to 300 metres, then take the path on the right along the Vezere on the other riverbank at the bottom of the *Puy Chamnard* that leads to the Minoterie base "Station Sports Nature" where you can do canoeing, kayaking, archery, climbing trees, mountain biking...

Ignore the footbridge on your right. Walk up the *Rue de l'Abreuvoir* on your left, in the direction of the old town. After the Simone de Beauvoir multimedia library, continue by the *Rue de la Justice*. Once at the *Place de l'Hospice*, turn back on your right, cross the Turgot Bridge and go on your way to the Small Station.
